

1. Only souvenir cards, intaglio-printed material, or related items are acceptable for consignment. Interested sellers should **contact the auctioneer with any questions BEFORE sending any material**. The fastest contact is by e-mail;

2. Consignors are responsible for adequately describing their lots, including S.C.C.S. numbers and their minimum bids. Lots must be of a minimum \$1 value.

3. Consignors will pay the postage to ship their lots and postage/insurance for return of unsold material. There is NO consignment fee, however, the S.C.C.S. will retain 10% of the selling price as a commission fee. Care shall be taken to protect any material submitted, but the auctioneer and the S.C.C.S. assumes NO liability and the consignor(s) should verify and/or provide their own insurance coverage.

4. **Lots will be sold to the highest bidder.** In the case of tie bids, the first bid received shall be awarded the lot. Bids below the "minimum" listed are NOT accepted. Bid in \$1.00 increments only, i.e., NOT "cents." There is NO "buyer's premium".

5. Successful bidders will pay the postage, insurance and packaging for their lots. NO lots will be shipped until the notice for same is paid in full. Payment is expected within ten (10) days of notice. Late payment may result in exclusion from future bidding. Checks should be made out to the auctioneer NOT the S.C.C.S.

6. Bids and/or questions may be e-mailed—the quickest way—regular mail, or carrier.





SCCS JOINS THE DIGITAL AGE

Last fall, on one of the online collector forums that I frequent, I was lamenting that the Souvenir Card Collector Society had long been in need of a website, but that no one in our group seemed to have the technical know-how to make that happen. I'm sure our members have seen the regular requests from our editor in the Journal regarding the need for this. I was pleased and surprised when one of the forum moderators volunteered his services to help get a website up and running. [See elsewhere in this issue for more details/images. Ed]

Rod Charlton II, who makes a living as a data manager, was that volunteer – and he soon became a new SCCS member. His technical assistance has been invaluable to this project, but at the start neither of us had much of an idea what the end result would look like. My primary vision was that the site needed to have a comprehensive reference library of high quality images showing a variety of souvenir card categories.

For many weeks Rod and I went back and forth on the minute details of page layout, background colors, font type, and general design. Most people don't consider all the major and minor decisions that are made on each page as they surf the web, but there is a great deal of thought involved. I spent a lot of time looking at the sites of other hobby organizations to see what worked and didn't work.

It was up to me to decide on the content we included. For this I consulted the SCCS numbering catalog and considered what members and potential new members would find most interesting and useful. Slowly we made a list of web pages, some of which were eventually put on the back burner for later inclusion. Others are simply placeholders until we have the time to add more content. The most important pages were eventually grouped into sections that we could turn into drop-down menus.

One of the last design decisions was the addition of engraved ornaments taken from various cards and intaglio prints. We used these to help "frame" and decorate the pages. This seems like a no-brainer now, but until we hit on this idea the site lacked visual appeal. These added a lot of elegance to the website and gave it a look similar to an actual souvenir card.

What has taken the most time (we knew it would) was building and populating the Photo Gallery sec-

tion. That remains an ongoing project, but the main categories are mostly in place: B, PS, and SO. There are also many smaller categories with images in place. Nearly all the categories from the Visual Reference are represented, though many have yet to be completed. You'll notice the page design is similar to the Visual Reference, which we used as a model, but the website provides full-color viewing and the ability to enlarge each card to full size.

The Forerunner section includes F, FPS, FSO, and FB cards, though these are mostly placeholders for now. I expect this section and others will see a gradual expansion as more volunteers step forward to provide images we can post. In fact, we also need volunteers to compile data for incomplete card categories and write short educational articles. Did I mention this has been a slow process?

In addition to Rod, numerous other SCCS members deserve thanks and recognition in getting this venture off the ground. **Bill Kriebel** and **Craig Lawson** provided a great many scanned images of philatelic cards and others. They also offered suggestions and corrections as we developed the site, along with **Lee Quast**, **Ken Barr**, **Steve Patrick**, **Curt Radford**, **Harry Corrigan**, **Chris Baker** and several former members. **Gregg Hopkins, Sr.** scanned many rare FPS Philatelic Truck cards. Everyone's thoughts and praise was very helpful both for moral support and to keep us on track.

I've neglected to provide the URL for members to find the site! That would be: www.sccscards.com

For many years we have also held another name in reserve: **souvenircards.org**. We are still debating which address is easiest to use and remember. I'd like to hear from members about their preference.

So welcome to your new website! Take a look around, keeping in mind that it's still a work in progress. Then let us know...

- What do you like or dislike about the site?
- What would you like to see added?
- Is there anything that needs to be fixed?
- Can you help us find images for the cards we do not have?

World War I: 100th Anniversary 2018 Intaglio Print Collection

World War One: The Great War 100th Anniversary

The Treasury Department issued currency and stamps produced by the Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP) to assist with financing the Great War. This collection highlights inspiring allegorical and historical figures featured on stamps, posters, and currency issued during the War.

The World War I 100th Anniversary commemorative collection consists of three intaglio prints — Entry, Homefront, and Victory.

Homefront

As World War One bore on, American citizens were called upon to make sacrifices in their daily lives. As a result, many Americans offered their free time to charities, invested their earnings in war bonds, and volunteered for military service.

In an effort to provide every American the opportunity to contribute to the war effort, the Bureau of Engraving and Printing began printing two moderately-priced savings stamps in late 1917. The \$5 War Savings Certificate Stamps were primarily sold through the Post Office Department for the Department of the Treasury.

The innovative financial instruments promoted patriotism through thrift and savings. Not only did Thrift Stamps and Savings Certificate Stamps generate revenue to support the war, they also reduced unnecessary spending, helping to control inflation and conserve raw materials.

Although relatively inexpensive to purchase, savings stamps generated close to \$1 billion to support World War One. Orders for Liberty Loans and savings stamps continued to push BEP's production capabilities to the limit throughout the war. Moreover, the bonds and stamps provided BEP engravers and printers a canvas to exhibit their expert workmanship. Compositions contained powerful American iconography and intricately engraved ornamentation. Featured here are two \$5 War Savings Certificate Stamps, posters from that era, and the header from a \$10,000 1919 war bond.

What's Going On			

In the course of building our new website, one of the concerns we heard on numerous occasions was "can you include a forum where members can post their questions?" In short, there was a clear need for an online forum.

These forums can be found for a great many hobbies: stamps, coins, baseball cards, even Hot Wheels cars. They go by different names -- bulletin boards, chat rooms -- but most often are known as collector forums. They are simply websites where collectors from all over the world can congregate and post their queries, observations, photos, and information relevant to their particular hobby.

Souvenir cards are a fairly small niche hobby, but they do show up on various other collector forums, primarily relating to paper money and stamps. If you visit the Links page under Resources on the SCCS website you can read about the most popular souvenir card topics on various forums.

Some organizations, like the Society of Paper Money Collectors do have collector forums embedded in their websites. But after observing the SPMC forum it was obvious that there was little "traffic", with few new topics being posted or responded to. I'm not sure many of their own members know it exists. It seems that the most successful forums are free, easily found through a search, and open to anyone curious and interested.

I regularly post on a handful of collector forums. One of the best I've come across is **PaperMoneyForum.com**, which is more of a grass-roots collector community rather than a commercial venture. This is where I got connected with the tech expert who has played a major role in our website construction. There are a good number of active and educated members who are regularly posting new topics and expanding on established ones. As you'd expect, the conversations revolve mostly around currency, but I often post on topics that relate to banknote engravings.

A few months ago we lobbied the site administrator of **PaperMoneyForum.com** to see if there might be a place for a sub-forum category dedicated to souvenir cards and security engraving. It took a little time, but that forum is now in place at:

www.papermoneyforum.com/?forum=671571

You can also find it under "Hobby Partners" on Paper Money Forum's home page (opposite page). **Rod Charlton** and I have been designated the sub-forum moderators and the site hosting is being generously provided at no cost.

The new sub-forum has already been populated with numerous topics that were shifted over from the main forum. A recent sampling included "BEP eagle on silk hankie," "WWII USA Savings Bonds & Saving Stamps Cards," "Match That Vignette," "Spider Press Exhibit," and "American Bank Note vellum vignette sheets."

At present, our new forum is just finding its feet. Experience has shown that success depends mostly on a core group of members posting regularly. Active forums attract new members and new forum members will hopefully translate into new SCCS members. I encourage everyone to join this forum (it's easy and costs nothing), get comfortable, and post something. If you've never visited a collector forum here's your chance to try something new. It's an excellent way to meet others who share your interests and learn more about the hobby in an interactive way.

If you want a glimpse of our future – this is it!





ONE MORE ABNCo DISCOVERY

While researching the SO discovery cards for the last issue of the Journal, I happened on a couple of images that provide answers to another long-ago mystery.

Back around Christmas 1993, American Bank Note announced the release of another batch of their engraved holiday greeting cards. This was reported on page 38 of the 4th Quarter 1993 Souvenir Card Journal. But there was another product that got a mere mention in the article – a reprint of a St. Nicholas Bank of New York stock certificate. ABNC was only offering it framed and with shipping it was priced at almost \$100. No pictures of this reprint were forthcoming and marketing was practically nil. I doubt if more than a handful of these were sold; I have never seen a copy, first-hand.


However, I did turn up a couple images recently from an online auction. These are low resolution and unfortunately nothing better was available. But this piece clearly shows the usual ABNC text found on the back of souvenir cards and it's dated 1993, so we can safely assume this is the St. Nicholas Bank reprint. I've included a close-up of the engraving of St. Nick from one of ABNC's Christmas cards.


Though similar, this isn't technically a souvenir card since it's not a souvenir of any event. It's more like the Kingdom of Hawaii banknote reprints of 1995. Consequently, it doesn't merit a catalog number. Details on the size of the reprint and how many were printed or sold are unknown. If another member has further information, I'd like to hear about it!

An alternative engraving of Santa and sleigh was used on SO-121, which appears on the previous page, in a show-canceled version. Ed.]


